Finding Associated with Complaint

591-1-1-.32(7) requires that children be supervised at all times and that the persons supervising in the child care area be alert, able to respond promptly to the needs and actions of the children being supervised, as well as the actions of the chaperones and Students-in-Training, and provide timely attention to the children's actions and needs. It was determined based on interviews and review of video surveillance, that on January 9, 2020, a one-year-old child, did sustain a cut to the upper left forehead, as a result of the staff member not providing watchful oversight of the one-year-old as the staff member was on their cellphone and in the restroom with a hair brush.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will train Staff and monitor to ensure they are providing supervision and watchful oversight to the children at all times.
