Finding Associated with Complaint

591-1-1-.26(9) requires the playground to be kept clean, free from litter and free of hazards, such as but not limited to rocks, exposed tree roots and exposed sharp edges of concrete. It was determined based on investigative findings that on February 26, 2018, a two-year-old child sustained ant bites to the right hand and both ankles while on the three-year-old playground. The two-year-old child had an allergic reaction to the ant bites resulting in professional medical attention.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will remove any litter and fix or remove hazards from the playground and will routinely monitor the playground and remove litter and hazards.

Staffing and Supervision

591-1-1-.32 Staff: Child Ratios and Group Size(CR)

Not Met

Finding Associated with Complaint

591-1-1-.32(2) requires the Center maintain Staff: child ratios in mixed-age groups based on the age of the youngest group of children that includes more than twenty percent of the total number of children in the mixedage group. It was determined based on investigative findings that on February 26, 2018, a ratio of 1:13 children was present on the three-year-old playground when a ratio of 2:13 was required. Of those children reported to be present three were two-years-old, six were three-years-old children and four were four-years-old.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will provide adequate staff when there is a mixed-age group.

Finding Associated with Complaint

591-1-1-.32(4)(b) allows children who turn three years old during the regular school year to remain with two year olds for the remainder of the school year but requires agreement from the older child's Parent(s) for the continued placement. It was determined based on investigative findings that on February 26, 2018, six three-year-old children and four four-year-old children were housed with three two-year-old, without required parental permission.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will secure parental permission and keep it on file.
