However, as stated above, any violations of identical rule(s) will require the department to treat any and all additional rule violations identified in the investigation as repeated rule violations.

All rule violations found in relation to a complaint or incident investigation will be associated with the date the investigation was closed.

If you do not have this liability insurance, you are required to post a notice with ½ inch letters in a conspicuous location in the program, notify the parent or guardian of each child in care in writing, obtain their signature to acknowledge receipt and maintain this written acknowledgment on file at the program at all times while the child attends the program and for 12 months after the child's last date of attendance. (O.C.G.A. Section 20-1A-4)

## **Finding Associated with Complaint**

591-1-1-.03(9) requires center staff to refrain from engaging in, or allowing children or other adults to engage in, activities that could be detrimental to a child's health or well-being, such as but not limited to, horse play, rough play, wrestling, and picking up a child in a manner that could cause injury. It was determined during an investigation that on February 7, 2019, a staff member picked up a two-year-old child in a manner that could cause injury. The staff member picked the child up by both arms and playfully dangled the child while walking around the room. It was speculated that the child sustained an arm injury but medical treatment was not obtained and the child returned to the center the following day.

# POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will review requirements with Staff to ensure that appropriate activities are conducted with children.
