Consultant observed the playground during inclement weather on this date. Please monitor for standing water, beehives, and beds, and redistribute the resilient surface.

Finding

591-1-1-.26(6) requires that playground equipment provide an opportunity for the children to engage in a variety of experiences and shall be age-appropriate. For example, toddlers shall not be permitted to swing in swings designed for School-age Children. The outdoor equipment shall be free of lead-based paint, sharp corners and shall be regularly maintained in such a way as to be free of rust and splinters that could pose significant safety hazard to the children. All equipment shall be arranged so as not to obstruct supervision of children. It was determined based on consultant's observation of the center's playground equipment a potential entrapment hazard existed in that the "Little Tikes" sliding equipment was observed to be cracked at the top of the platform of the equipment located on the front left side of the playground.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will provide a variety of age-appropriate equipment that is arranged so as not to obstruct supervision of children. Staff will check the equipment daily to ensure that the equipment is free of hazards, rust and splinters.

Finding

591-1-1-.36(3)(a-c) requires the Director and each Staff person responsible for or who participates in the transportation of children to meet the following requirements: (a) complete two (2) clock hours of transportation training on or before June 30, 2015 and at least every two years thereafter. (b) Effective July 1, 2015, the Director and each Staff person who will be responsible for or participate in the transportation of children shall have completed two (2) clock hours of transportation training prior to assuming any duties related to the transportation of children and at least every two years thereafter. (c) Any transportation training completed should be state approved or state accepted training. It was determined based on consultant's review of staff files three of three staff members did not have evidence of their current transportation training on file. It was further determined based on consultant's review of staff files the director did not have evidence of a current transportation training certificate on file.

The center will ensure that the director, center staff, and any person responsible for the transportation of children has completed the required transportation training.

Finding
