#### **Finding Associated with Complaint**

591-1-Ī-.20(2) requires that written authorization to dispense medication is limited to two weeks unless otherwise prescribed by a physician or authorized under Georgia law. Medication shall only be dispensed out of its original container which must be labeled with the child's name or as authorized under Georgia law. It was determined based on an investigation that on May 22, 2019, center staff gave a one-year-old child 12.5 milliliters of medication instead of 2.5 milliliters as prescribed. The child received professional medical attention as a precaution.

#### POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will train all Staff on the medication requirements. The designated person(s) will monitor the dispensing of medications. The health and safety coordinator will received Pro Solutions training and one on one training with the director for several weeks before the staff member is allowed to administer medication alone.
