

Finding Associated with Complaint

591-1-129(3) requires the Director or designated person-in-charge to report or cause to be reported to the Department within 24 hours or the next work day: any death of a child while in the care of the Center; any
serious illness or injury requiring hospitalization or professional medical attention other than first aid of a child while in the care of the Center; any situation when a child in care becomes missing, such as, but not limited to, a child who is left on a vehicle, a child who leaves the building, playground, or property, or a child who is left behind on any trip; any fire; any structural disaster; and any emergency situation that requires temporarily relocating children. It was determined during an investigation that on May 28, 2019, a two-year-old child
sustained an injury to the lip that required professional medical treatment. The child was treated and returned to the center following the visit, with special food restrictions given by the physician. Center staff failed to report the incident to the Department as required.
