#### **Finding Associated with Complaint**

591-1-1-.32(7) requires that children be supervised at all times and that the persons supervising in the child care area be alert, able to respond promptly to the needs and actions of the children being supervised, as well as the actions of the chaperones and Students-in-Training, and provide timely attention to the children's actions and needs.

It was determined that on June 17, 2019, children were not adequately supervised when a one-year-old child sustained a laceration to the left hand. A staff person was holding an exterior door open with her back to allow children to enter the classroom from the playground. The staff person was not aware that the child had crawled behind her. When the door opened slightly wider, the bottom of the door opened over the top of the child's hand, causing a laceration. The child received professional medical treatment.
