591-1-1-1.12(2) requires that all equipment and furniture be free from hazardous conditions such as, but not limited to, sharp rough edges or toxic paint; and be kept clean. It was determined, based on an observation that the blue chairs and couch set in Room 3 and Room 5 were torn, exposing foam and wood with blue duct tape peeling off the couch set on this date. Finding

591-1-1-35(3) requires the Center to maintain Staff: child ratios as follows to provide proper supervision of children engaged in swimming and water-related activities in water over two feet deep: Under 2 1/2 years = 1:2, 2 1/2 to 4 years = 1:5, 4 years and older who cannot swim a distance of 15 yards unassisted = 1:6, 4 years and older who can swim a distance of 15 yards unassisted as determined by a swimming test = 1:15. At least one qualified lifeguard must be present. Copies of certificates from a recognized water-safety class may be accepted in lieu of requiring each child to take a swimming test to determine if the child can swim 15 yards unassisted. It was determined, based on a review of records that the center did not have swim test documentation with the results of the test on file for thirty (30) children enrolled in summer camp on this date. It was further determined, based on a review of records that on June 20, 2018 a 1:20 staff:child ratio was documented on the field trip form to Jefferson City Pool.

Finding 591-1-125(13) requires that potentially hazardous equipment, materials and supplies be stored in a locked area inaccessible to children. It was determined, based on an observation that gardening tools, a wheelbarrow, weed eater and several other hazardous items was located in an unlocked licensed classroom (Room 7). It was further determined that a plastic bag (located in Room 5), deodorant, and hanging cords (located in Room 9) were accessible to children in care on this date.

Finding
591-1-126(6) requires that playground equipment provide an opportunity for the children to engage in a variety of experiences and shall be age-appropriate. For example, toddlers shall not be permitted to swing in swings
designed for School-age Children. The outdoor equipment shall be free of lead-based paint, sharp corners and
shall be regularly maintained in such a way as to be free of rust and splinters that could pose significant safety
hazard to the children. All equipment shall be arranged so as not to obstruct supervision of children. It was
determined that a tricycle missing one pedal was located on the covered patio area. It was further determined,
based on observation that 40 inch round web nest swings were observed on the left (playground A) and back
(playground B and C) children's outside play areas on this date, these swings were located on playgrounds
other than the after school playground. The consultant observed two-year olds on the nest swings. Center staff
researched the brand/manufacturer of the swings and manufacturer recommended age stated 8 - 17 years old.

observation that on Playground A, there was exposed plastic piping near the sidewalk that created a tripping
hazard. It was further determined that a four inch deep hole was observed near the children's water play area
on playground D on this date.

Finding 591-1-113(5) requires Center Staff to have emergency medical information on each child who goes on a field trip that includes allergies, special medical needs and conditions, current prescribed medications required to be taken on a daily basis for a chronic condition, the name and phone number of the child's doctor, the local medical facility the Center uses in the area where the Center is located, and the telephone numbers where the parent can be reached. The emergency medical information shall be left at the Center as well as taken on the trip in the possession of the adult in charge of the trip. It was determined, based on a review of records that seventeen children were missing emergency medical information forms to go on field trips on this date.

Finding 591-1-113(6) requires Center Staff to ensure each child on a field trip has on their person their name, and the Center's name, address and telephone number. It was determined, based on consultant's review of children's name tags that three children attending a field trip to Bear Hollow Zoo on July 5, 2018 did not have on their name tags on this date.

Finding 591-1-136(4)(a) requires an annual safety check for each vehicle. The annual safety check, completed by a trained individual, should include a check of the: tires, headlights, horn, taillights, turn signals, brake lights, brakes, suspension, exhaust system, steering, windows, windshields and windshield wipers. A copy of the annual safety check will be kept in the Center or on the vehicle and should include evidence of any repairs and/or replacements that were identified as needed on the inspection report. It was determined, based on a review of records that the center did not have an annual vehicle safety check for a personal vehicle used to transport children on field trips.

Finding 591-1-136(7)(d)2. requires that the second designated Staff person conduct a check of the vehicle immediately upon the completion of the first check of the vehicle. The responsible person shall physically walk through the entire vehicle; visually inspect all seat surfaces, under all seats and in all compartments or recesses in the vehicle's interior; and sign the passenger transportation checklist(s), indicating all of the children have exited the vehicle. There shall be continuous watchful oversight of the vehicle between the first check and second check. It was determined, based on a review of records that a second check was not documented in writing for a field trip conducted on May 31, 2018 to Atlanta Zoo.
