If you do not have this liability insurance, you are required to post a notice with ½ inch letters in a conspicuous location in the program, notify the parent or guardian of each child in care in writing, obtain their signature to acknowledge receipt and maintain this written acknowledgment on file at the program at all times while the child attends the program and for 12 months after the child's last date of attendance. Finding

290-2-3-.19(1)(a)2 requires that a mattress shall be provided for each crib and other equipment approved for infant sleep and shall be firm, tight-fitting, at least two inches (2") thick and covered with waterproof, washable material. Before a change of occupant, each mattress shall be cleaned with a disinfectant. It was determined based upon consultant's observation, that two out of the two mattresses inside on the cribs utilized by infants were not firm and at least two inches thick on this date.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Home Provider will remove mattresses that do not meet requirements and ensure that infant sleep mattresses are firm, tight-fitting, at least 2 inches thick, covered with waterproof, washable material and cleaned with a disinfectant before a change in occupant.

Finding

290-2-3-.19(1)(a)3 requires that each crib and other equipment approved for infant sleep shall have only an individual, tight-fitting sheet which is changed daily or more often as needed and prior to a change of occupant. It was determined based upon consultant's observation, that two out of the two cribs utilized by infants did not have tight-fitting sheets as required.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Home Provider will ensure that each crib or other equipment approved for infant sleep has a tight-fitting and clean sheets that is changed daily or more often as needed and prior to a change of occupant.

Finding

290-2-3-.19(1)b)3 requires that sheets or similar coverings for cots or mats shall either be marked for individual use or laundered daily. If individually marked, they must be laundered weekly or more frequently if needed. It was determined based upon consultant's observation, that the cots utilized by children during nap time did not have sheets on them on this date.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Home Provider will launder sheets for cots or mats as required.

Finding

290-2-3-.11(1)(d) prohibits Personnel from dispensing prescription or nonprescription medications to a Child without specific written authorization from the Child's physician or Parent. All medications shall be stored as authorized by Georgia law or in accordance with the prescription or label instructions and kept in places that are inaccessible to children. Each dose of medication given to a Child shall be documented showing the Child's name, name of medication, date and time given, and the name of the person giving the medication. It was determined based upon consultant's observation, that a bottle of little remedies Gripe Water was located on a shelve in the play area and accessible to children.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Home will obtain written authorization before giving medicine to a Child; will document each time medicine is administered to a child; will store medicine as required in an area that is locked or not accessible to children; and will store medicine that must be refrigerated in a leak-proof container that is inaccessible to children.
