#### **Finding Associated with Complaint**

591-1-1-.32(7) requires that children be supervised at all times and that the persons supervising in the child care area be alert, able to respond promptly to the needs and actions of the children being supervised, as well as the actions of the chaperones and Students-in-Training, and provide timely attention to the children's actions and needs. It was determined that on September 3, 2019, at approximately 2:20 p.m., center staff failed to provide adequate supervision in the two-year-old classroom when it was stated that a staff member left a two-year-old child alone and un supervised, asleep, for an undetermined period of time, in the classroom, as the rest of the class transitioned onto the playground and on September 17, 2019 at 12:12 p.m., center staff failed to provide adequate supervision when it was stated that staff members left two two-year-old children alone and unsupervised, sleeping for two minutes, in the classroom, while the center conducted a fire drill.

#### **POI** (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will train Staff and monitor to ensure they are providing supervision and watchful oversight to the children at all times.
