- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive background clearance
- · All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee

O.C.G.A. Section 42.1.12(i)(2) requires Bright from the Start: Georgia Department of Early Care and Learning to notify licensed child care programs on accessing and retrieving from the Georgia Bureau of Investigation's (GBI) website a list of the names and addresses of all registered sexual offenders. It was determined based on observation that in Classroom B, there were two small holes in the wall to the left of the room beside the computer.

Finding

591-1-1-.26(4) requires that playgrounds be protected from traffic or other hazards by a (4) four foot high fence or other barrier approved by this Department. Fencing material shall not present a hazard to children and shall be maintained so as to prevent children from leaving the playground area by any means other than through an approved access route. Fence gates shall be kept closed except when persons are entering or exiting the area. It was determined based on observation the fencing on the Outside Playground for Pre-K to the left of the playground measured three feet and seven inches and the fencing at the back of the same playground measured three feet and four inches. Furthermore, it was determined based on observation that the fencing to the back of the Outside Playground for Toddlers measured three feet and four inches and the fencing to the right side of the same playground measured three feet and seven inches.

In addition the bolts on the gates of the playground for toddlers and the playground for Pre-K measured over than the required two thread lengths.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will routinely check the fence to determine if it is in good repair and remains at least 4 feet high, and will repair any hazards. The Center will train Staff to identify and report any fence hazards and to keep the fence gates closed when not in use.

The center will ensure that the height of the fence will meet the required height of four feet by adding additional fencing material to the top of the fence or digging out around the fence. The center will also ensure that the bolts are shaved down to the two threads that is required.
