The purpose of this visit was to conduct a Monitoring visit.

The findings of the report was reviewed with the provider and a copy of the report was left while on site.

Revision made to the initial report. Center staff notified via telephone call on 8/6/19 @ 8:52 a.m.

- New records checks will be required to be completed if a staff member experiences a six month break in service from the child care industry
- New clearance is required at least once every five years
- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive background clearance
- All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee

O.C.G.A. Section 42.1.12(i)(2) requires Bright from the Start: Georgia Department of Early Care and Learning to notify licensed child care programs on accessing and retrieving from the Georgia Bureau of Investigation's (GBI) website a list of the names and addresses of all registered sexual offenders. 591-1-1-.26 -Please ensure that all equipment and toys are free of chipping and peeling paint.

#### **Finding**

591-1-1-.26(4) requires that playgrounds be protected from traffic or other hazards by a (4) four foot high fence or other barrier approved by this Department. Fencing material shall not present a hazard to children and shall be maintained so as to prevent children from leaving the playground area by any means other than through an approved access route. Fence gates shall be kept closed except when persons are entering or exiting the area. It was determined based on observation that the fence on the left side of the main playground had two nails protruding that were at least one inch in length. The fence at the back of the main playground had two nails that were protruding from it that were at least one inch in length. The wooden fence on the main and infant/toddler playground were leaning. There were small gaps in the fence that needed to be secured as the boards were separating from the fence in different areas throughout each playground. The wood on the infant/toddler playground had chipped and splintered wood at the bottom of the fence.

Note: The gate on the left side of the main playground was cited at the previous visit for not being closed, however, it was observed to have an operable latch that was being used and the gate was closed.

## POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will routinely check the fence to determine if it is in good repair and remains at least four feet high, and will repair any hazards. The Center will train Staff to identify and report any fence hazards and to keep the fence gates closed when not in use.

#### **Finding**

591-1-1-.09(1)(j) requires that for portability for Directors, Employees and Provisional Employees, excluding Students-in-Training, only the most recently issued determination letter is eligible for portability and must be ported electronically. A Center may accept a satisfactory Fingerprint Records Check Determination letter or a satisfactory Comprehensive Records Check Determination letter issued by the Department if the Records Check Clearance Date is within the preceding 12 months from the hire date, the individual has not had a lapse of employment from the child care industry that lasted for 180 days (6 months) or longer, and the Center does not know or reasonably should not know that the individual's satisfactory status has changed. It was determined based on observation that there were four staff members who worked with staffing agencies and had not been ported to the center, however, they were within their portability dates. Three of the staff members were present at the center on the day of the visit. All four staff had satisfactory comprehensive criminal record checks with their staffing agency.

IMMEDIATE CORRECTION - The Center will maintain employee records to ensure that only the most recently issued determination letter is electronically ported for Directors, Employees and Provisional Employees, excluding Students-in-Training. A Center may accept a satisfactory Fingerprint Records Check Determination letter or a satisfactory Comprehensive Records Check Determination letter issued by the Department if the Records Check Clearance Date is within the preceding 12 months from the hire date, the individual has not had a lapse of employment from the child care industry that lasted for 180 days (6 months) or longer, and the Center does not know or reasonably should not know that the individual's satisfactory status has changed. The program's owner or an officer/member of the corporation must view the A to Z Background Check video units pertaining to this records check rule and return the signed affidavit within one week from this visit date. The Center will check employee records regularly to ensure CRC rules are maintained.
