Finding Associated with Complaint

591-1-1-.03(8) requires a center to provide individual attention to each child by responding promptly to the child's distress signals and need for comfort. It was determined, based on an investigation, that on March 6, 2018, center staff failed to provide individual attention to a six-year-old child when the child sustained a second degree burn to the face. The child reported the injury to center staff as he cried and held his face and the staff member did not render aid.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will provide staff training in when and how to respond appropriately to children's distress signals and need for comfort.

Health and Hygiene

591-1-1-.07 Children's Health

Not Met

Finding Associated with Complaint

591-1-1-.07(2) requires Center Staff to immediately notify Parents and obtain specific instructions until the child can be picked up or returned to the group when professional medical attention is required, or when the child experiences symptoms of moderate discomfort such as elevated temperature, vomiting or diarrhea and to notify Parents by the end of the day when professional medical attention is not required, when the child experiences symptoms of less than moderate discomfort or when the child experiences an adverse reaction to prescribed medication which does not constitute moderate discomfort. It was determined, based on an investigation that center staff did not give proper parental notification on March 6, 2018, when a six-year-old child sustained a second degree burn to the face. The child reported the injury to center staff and center staff did not inform the parent.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will provide notification and obtain instructions as required and will train Staff to familiarize them with the notification requirements and the Center's procedures for following them.

591-1-1-.17 Hygiene(CR)

Not Met

Finding Associated with Complaint

591-1-1-.17(2) requires that Personnel, to the extent possible, keep children clean, dry and comfortable. It was determined based on an investigation that center staff failed to keep children, clean, dry, and comfortable on March 6, 2018, when a six-year-old child sustained a second degree burn to the face. Center staff did not attend to the child's visible signs of discomfort and pain.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will train staff, review regularly, and monitor.

Staffing and Supervision

591-1-1-.32 Supervision(CR)

Not Met

Finding Associated with Complaint

591-1-1-.32(7) requires that children be supervised at all times and that the persons supervising in the child care area be alert, able to respond promptly to the needs and actions of the children being supervised, as well as the actions of the chaperones and Students-in-Training, and provide timely attention to the children's actions and needs. It was determined, based on an investigation that that on March 6, 2018, center staff failed to provide adequate supervision when a six-year-old child was allowed to get water from a water cooler, with a hot and cold button, without staff supervision and sustained a second degree burn on his face. The child was allowed to exit the center vehicle, walk unassisted and unsupervised through a classroom and lobby area to access the water.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will train Staff and monitor to ensure they are providing supervision and watchful oversight to the children at all times.
