- New records checks will be required to be completed if a staff member experiences a six month break in service from the child care industry
- New clearance is required at least once every five years
- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive background clearance
- · All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- · Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee

#### **Finding Associated with Complaint**

591-1-1-.32(7) requires that children be supervised at all times and that the persons supervising in the child care area be alert, able to respond promptly to the needs and actions of the children being supervised, as well as the actions of the chaperones and Students-in-Training, and provide timely attention to the children's actions and needs. It was determined based on an investigation that on May 1, 2019, supervision was not adequately provided when a one-year-old child's right, middle finger was partially amputated when caught in a closed door. Medical attention was required. At the time of the incident, staff were washing children's hands, cleaning the kitchen, laying down mats and preparing children for nap, however, no staff persons were aware of the children by the bathroom door where the incident occurred, therefore, could not prevent the incident.

#### **POI** (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will train Staff and monitor to ensure they are providing supervision and watchful oversight to the children at all times.
