#### **Finding Associated with Complaint**

591-1-1-.03(9) requires center staff to refrain from engaging in, or allowing children or other adults to engage in, activities that could be detrimental to a child's health or well-being, such as but not limited to, horse play, rough play, wrestling, and picking up a child in a manner that could cause injury. It was determined based on an investigation completed by the consultant that on March 5, 2018 a staff member placed their hand on a one-year-old child's head to ensure that they remained lying down during nap time. Staff stated that the intent of the action was not to discipline but to remind the child that it was nap time. Consultant determined that the intent or the action was not overt, but discussed with the provider that such an activity could be detrimental to the well being of the child and is not in best practice.

#### **POI** (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will review requirements with Staff to ensure that appropriate activities are conducted with children.
