- New records checks will be required to be completed if a staff member experiences a six month break in service from the child care industry
- New clearance is required at least once every five years
- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive background clearance
- · All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee

O.C.G.A. Section 42.1.12(i)(2) requires Bright from the Start: Georgia Department of Early Care and Learning to notify licensed child care programs on accessing and retrieving from the Georgia Bureau of Investigation's (GBI) website a list of the names and addresses of all registered sexual offenders. Please see GBI's website located at http://gbi.georgia.gov to access the Georgia Sex Offender Registry.

If you do not have this liability insurance, you are required to post a notice with ½ inch letters in a conspicuous location in the program, notify the parent or guardian of each child in care in writing, obtain their signature to acknowledge receipt and maintain this written acknowledgment on file at the program at all times while the child attends the program and for 12 months after the child's last date of attendance. # Finding

591-1-1-.25(13) requires that potentially hazardous equipment, materials and supplies be stored in a locked area inaccessible to children. It was determined based on observation that in a unlock bathroom drawer in room D there was hand sanitizer, two ice packs, nighttime baby wash and antibacterial ointment accessible to children.

# POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will identify all hazardous items and keep them in a locked area inaccessible to children. The Center will inform all Staff about hazardous items and the safe storage of those items. The consultant removed the items and gave them to the staff who placed them inaccessible to the children.

# 591-1-1-.26 Playgrounds(CR)

# **Finding**

591-1-1-.26(4) requires that playgrounds be protected from traffic or other hazards by a (4) four foot high fence or other barrier approved by this Department. Fencing material shall not present a hazard to children and shall be maintained so as to prevent children from leaving the playground area by any means other than through an approved access route. Fence gates shall be kept closed except when persons are entering or exiting the area. It was determined based on observation, that the fencing on the front right of the playground had a hole that measured approximately six inches in length and twelve inches in width.

# POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will routinely check the fence to determine if it is in good repair and remains at least 4 feet high, and will repair any hazards and holes.

# **Finding**

591-1-1-.26(8) requires climbing and swinging equipment to have a resilient surface beneath the equipment and the fall zone from such equipment must be adequately maintained by the Center to assure continuing resiliency. It was determined based on observation that the larger play structure with swings had approximately four inches of resilient surface at the swings when six was needed and the smaller play structure with swings had approximately zero to one inches of resilient surface when six inches was needed.

# POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will add additional resilient surfacing to the fall zones where needed and check daily.

# **Finding**

591-1-1-.26(9) requires the playground to be kept clean, free from litter and free of hazards, such as but not limited to rocks, exposed tree roots and exposed sharp edges of concrete. It was determined based on observation that the following hazards were observed on the playground:

- -Staggered pavers on the front right side on the playground that posed a potential tripping hazard.
- -The PVC pipe was missing an end cap which left a hole measuring approximately four inches wide posing a potential entrapment hazard.
- -The black tarp was exposed where the little tykes slides were housed, posing a potential tripping hazard.
- -The wooden barrier where the larger slide with swings was housed had four protruding screws measuring approximately one and a half to two inches long.
- -The wooden barrier where the smaller slide with swings was housed had two protruding screws measuring approximately one and a half to two inches long.

# POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will fix or remove hazards from the playground and will routinely monitor the playground and remove litter and hazards.

Medications requiring refrigeration shall be placed in a leak-proof container in a refrigerator that is not accessible to the children. It was determined based on observation that in room C medications such as children's Tylenol and Motrin was housed in a child's backpack accessible to children.

The Center will train Staff on the safe and proper storage of medication and monitor to ensure that the rule is met.

It was determined based on a review of staff files that the director did not submit both a records check application to the department and fingerprints to an authorized fingerprinting site to obtain a comprehensive background check.

The Center will ensure that every actual and potential Director, Employee and Provisional Employee of a Child Care Learning Center submit both a Records Check Application to the Department and Fingerprints to an authorized fingerprinting site as required.

# **Finding**

591-1-1-.09(1.)(b) requires the Center to ensure that every Director has a valid and current satisfactory Comprehensive Records Check Determination on file prior to being present at the Center while any child is present for care or before an individual age 17 or older resides in the Center. The Comprehensive Records Check Determination must have a Records Check Clearance Date that is no older than the preceding 12 months of the hire date; provided, however, if the Director has had a lapse of employment from the child care industry that lasted for 180 days (6 months) or longer, a new satisfactory Comprehensive Records Check Determination is required. It was determined based on a review of staff files that the director did not have a satisfactory comprehensive records check determination on file.

# POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will ensure that the Director has a valid and current satisfactory Comprehensive Records Check Determination on file prior to being present at the Center while any child is present for care or before an individual age 17 or older resides in the Center. The Comprehensive Records Check Determination must have a Records Check Clearance Date that is no older than the preceding 12 months of the hire date; provided, however, if the Director has had a lapse of employment from the child care industry that lasted for 180 days (6 months) or longer, a new satisfactory Comprehensive Records Check Determination is required. The consultant explained to the director that they must have someone with a comprehensive background supervise them at all times. A 1-day letter was left.
