**Activities and Equipment** 

591-1-1-.03 Activities Not Met

#### **Finding**

591-1-1-.03(6) requires Center Staff to ensure children less than three years of age do not spend more than one-half hour of time consecutively in confining equipment, such as swings, highchairs, jump seats, carriers or walkers. Children shall use such equipment only when they are awake. Such children shall be allowed time to play on the floor daily. Infants shall have supervised tummy time on the floor daily when they are awake. It was determined by consultant's observation that a three and four-month-old iwere observed in bouncer seats for the duration of the visit.

#### POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will train Staff to use confining equipment appropriately, to provide supervised floor play daily for children under three years of age, including infants, and will monitor regularly.

#### 591-1-1-.12 Equipment & Toys(CR)

**Not Met** 

#### Comment

A variety of equipment and toys were observed throughout the center.

#### Finding

591-1-1-.12(2) requires that all equipment and furniture be free from hazardous conditions such as, but not limited to, sharp rough edges or toxic paint; and be kept clean. It was determined based on consultant observation that the carpet in the infant area was heavily stained.

#### **POI** (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will ensure that the carpet is cleaned.

#### 591-1-1-.35 Swimming Pools & Water-related Activities(CR)

#### 591-1-1-.19 License Capacity(CR)

**Not Met** 

#### Finding

591-1-1-.19(1) requires a Center to provide 35 square feet of usable space per child, which will determine the Center's License capacity. It was determined based on consultant observation that the center license capacity is 18 and 19 children were present during the walk through and five more children arrived for after school.

#### POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will limit the number of children in this space to the licensed capacity.

#### 591-1-1-.25 Physical Plant - Safe Environment(CR)

**Not Met** 

#### **Finding**

591-1-1-.25(15) requires that any outside storage or equipment area be locked, separated from the children by a barrier or enclosure, and shall not be accessible to the children. It was determined by consultant observation that a storage shed on the outside play area was unlocked and posed a hazard to children.

#### POI (Plan of Improvement)

Center Staff will routinely check outside storage or equipment areas to ensure they are locked or otherwise inaccessible to children.

Correction Deadline: 3/28/2018

#### **Finding**

591-1-1-.25(17) requires that the Center premises be free of plants and shrubs which are poisonous or hazardous. It was determined by consultant's observation that vines and ivy or sumac were growing through the fencing on the left of the play area.

#### POI (Plan of Improvement)

The harmful item will be removed.

Correction Deadline: 3/28/2018

#### Finding

591-1-1-.25(3) requires the Center and surrounding premises to be kept clean, free of debris and in good repair. Hygienic measures such as, but not limited to, screened windows and proper waste disposal procedures shall be utilized to minimize the presence of rodents, flies, roaches and other vermin at the Center. It was determined by consultant's observation that the base board in the infant area was detached and posing a hazard.

#### POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will have the Center and surrounding areas cleaned, make repairs where needed, and remove all debris is removed. The Center will implement a plan to keep areas clean and in good repair that includes regular monitoring.

#### 591-1-1-.26 Playgrounds(CR)

**Not Met** 

#### Comment

Discussed maintenance of resilient surface. Please fluff and redistribute.

#### **Finding**

591-1-1-.26(4) requires that playgrounds be protected from traffic or other hazards by a (4) four foot high fence or other barrier approved by this Department. Fencing material shall not present a hazard to children and shall be maintained so as to prevent children from leaving the playground area by any means other than through an approved access route. Fence gates shall be kept closed except when persons are entering or exiting the area. It was determined by consultant observation that the bar attached to the top fencing on the back playground area was detaching and posed a hazard to children in care.

#### POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will routinely check the fence to determine if it is in good repair and remains at least 4 feet high, and will repair any hazards. The Center will train Staff to identify and report any fence hazards and to keep the fence gates closed when not in use.

Correction Deadline: 3/28/2018

#### Finding

591-1-1-.26(9) requires the playground to be kept clean, free from litter and free of hazards, such as but not limited to rocks, exposed tree roots and exposed sharp edges of concrete. It was determined by consultant observation that the PVC pipe landscaping was broken and detached posing a tripping hazard. Also, sticks and large pieces of mulch that appeared as darts were observed on the back playground area and posed a hazard. In addition consultant's observed an uncovered grill on the route to the playground area.

#### POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will remove any litter and fix or remove hazards from the playground and will routinely monitor the playground and remove litter and hazards.

## **Health and Hygiene**

#### 591-1-1-.10 Diapering Areas & Practices(CR)

Not Met

#### **Finding**

591-1-1-.10(4) requires that if diapers are changed on a diaper changing surface, the surface shall be smooth, non porous, and equipped with a guard or rails to prevent falls. Between each diaper change, the diaper changing surface shall be cleaned with a disinfectant and dried with a single-use disposable towel. It was determined by consultant that the diaper changing surface in the infant/toddler area was non-porous and not easily cleaned.

#### POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will ensure there is a smooth, nonporous changing surface that has a guard or rails for safety in each classroom that houses children wearing diapers. Center Staff will be trained and have adequate supplies to properly clean the diaper changing surface between each diaper change.

Correction Deadline: 3/28/2018

#### 591-1-1-.17 Hygiene(CR)

**Not Met** 

#### **Finding**

591-1-1-17(7) requires that children wash their hands with liquid soap and warm running water upon arrival for care, when moving from one child care group to another, upon re-entering the child care area after outside play, before and after eating meals and snacks, handling or touching food, playing in water; after toileting and diapering, playing in sand, touching animals or pets, and contact with bodily fluids and after contamination by any other means. It was determined by consultant that children were observed to wake up from nap and sit down at the table for snack without washing there hands.

#### POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will train Staff on required handwashing for children and Staff will ensure children's hands are washed when required. The Director will monitor for compliance.

The Center will provide a crib that is safety approved in compliance with CPSC and ASTM safety standards for each infant.
