- New records checks will be required to be completed if a staff member experiences a six month break in service from the child care industry
- New clearance is required at least once every five years
- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive
- All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee

Finding Associated with Complaint 591-1-103(9) requires center staff to refrain from engaging in, or allowing children or other adults to engage in, activities that could be detrimental to a child's health or well-being, such as but not limited to, horse play, rough play, wrestling, and picking up a child in a manner that could cause injury. It was determined based on investigative findings which included staff statements, interviews, and documentation revealed that during the month of November 2019 a staff member engaged in an activity that could be detrimental to a child's well-being when the staff member "flicked" the child's ear and laughed in an attempt to "connect and play" with the child. Staff statements further indicated that the child thought that the staff member was making fun of them. The staff member received disciplinary action as a result of the incident.

Staffing and Supervision

Finding Associated with Complaint

591-1-1-32(7) requires that children be supervised at all times appropriate to the individual age, needs and capabilities of each child. Such supervision must include, but not be limited to, indoor and outdoor activities, mealtimes, naptime, transportation, field trips, and transitions between activities. "Supervision" means that the appropriate number of Staff members are physically present in the area where children are being cared for and are providing watchful oversight to the children, volunteers and Students-in-Training. The persons supervising in the child care area must be alert, positioned to maximize their ability to hear and see the children at all times, and able to respond promptly to the needs and actions of the children being supervised, as well as the actions of the volunteers and Students-in-Training, and provide timely attention to the children's actions and needs. Staff shall be attentive and participating with all children during mealtimes and shall be seated within an arm's length away from children thirty-six (36) months of age and younger. It was determined based on investigative findings to include staff statements, interviews and observation of video footage, the allegation reported was substantiated. It was self-reported that on June 21, 2021 at approximately 5:40 PM, staff was 1 staff member and 10 children ages five and up were in the classroom at the time of the incident. It was revealed through video observation that staff was facing away from the the area of the classroom where the victim child was injured. It was also revealed through video observation that the staff member talked to another child when the incident occurred and appeared to not observe where the victim child turned a bench upright, climbed on top and jumped off injuring their arm. Staff failed to provide adequate supervision. The allegation was substantiated.
