Background checks were all reviewed on May 25, 2021. A virtual inspection was conducted on May 25, 2021 with the Provider. An in-person visit was not conducted due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Compliance with the Executive Order issued on February 15, 2021 was reviewed during the virtual inspection.

Additionally, Consultant discussed Rule changes that took effect on October 1, 2020 and emailed the Provider handouts with Frequently Asked Questions and related resources.

Consultant e-mailed the provider a copy of the COVID-19 Guidance for Georgia Childcare Facilities, Interim Guidance as of May 1, 2021.

- New records checks will be required to be completed if a staff member experiences a six month break in service from the child care industry
- New clearance is required at least once every five years
- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive background clearance
- All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee





Important New Deadlines:

Due to the ongoing COVID restrictions, the deadline to become Quality Rated for programs who want to continue to receive Childcare and Parent Services (CAPS), has been extended to at least December 31, 2021.

Finding 591-1-126(6) requires that playground equipment provide an opportunity for the children to engage in a variety of experiences and shall be age-appropriate. For example, toddlers shall not be permitted to swing in swings designed for School-age Children. The outdoor equipment shall be free of lead-based paint, sharp corners and shall be regularly maintained in such a way as to be free of rust and splinters that could pose significant safety hazard to the children. It was determined based upon observation that the following hazards were observed on the playground in that there was rust on the swing posts, on the left side of the swingset, there was an unsecured piece of dry rotted wood which created a gap between the piece of wood used as a border on the ground. Further, all four climbing tires on the playground structure were rotted and had tears in them and a basketball goal was observed titled forward on the concrete area.

Finding 591-1-126(4) requires that playgrounds be protected from traffic or other hazards by a (4) four foot high fence or other barrier approved by this Department. Fencing material shall not present a hazard to children and shall be maintained so as to prevent children from leaving the playground area by any means other than through an approved access route. Fence gates shall be kept closed except when persons are entering or exiting the area. It was determined based upon observation during the virtual visit the gate on the left side of the playground was broken, exposing rust and sharp edges. The following hazards were also observed: in the back left corner of the playground, a tree was observed growing on the fence, that portion of the fence was observed to be pushed down causing that area of the fence to measure less than four feet tall; on the back top left of the fence, the bar was observed to be not longer attached to the fence; on the right side, the fence was not observed to be secured to the post; the top portion of the fence, which was added to make the fence four feet tall, was not observed to be secure. Further, there was a large gap under the left gate and rust was observed throughout the
