* In Classroom B, chipped paint and drywall was exposed on the right side of the wall and the vents were dusty in the children's bathrooms.

* In Classroom D, the floor boarders in the children's bathrooms were not clean. Additionally, the boarders were rusted and discolored.

* In Classroom E, the left side wall boarders were chipped with paint and splintered wood was observed. The children's bathroom floor boarders were observed to be dirty and discolored tile in the bathrooms.

* In Classroom F, G, H, and I, the children's bathroom boarders were discolored and dirty at the base of the toilets. The baseboards had chipped paint with splintered wood around the classroom. Additionally, in Classroom H, the light was uncovered in the boy's bathroom.

* In Classroom J, there was a small spider and spider web in the corner of the bathroom in the classroom.
