

- New records checks will be required to be completed if a staff member experiences a six month break in service from the child care industry
- New clearance is required at least once every five years
- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive background clearance
- All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee

O.C.G.A. Section 42.1.12(i)(2) requires Bright from the Start: Georgia Department of Early Care and Learning to notify licensed child care programs on accessing and retrieving from the Georgia Bureau of Investigation's (GBI) website a list of the names and addresses of all registered sexual offenders. Finding Associated with Complaint

591-1-1-.17(2) requires that Personnel, to the extent possible, keep children clean, dry and comfortable. It was determined that on April 20, 2022, a five-year-old child was not comfortable as it was reported by the child and staff members that the child was crying when found due to being left alone in the classroom unsupervised. The staff member responsible for supervising the child left the child alone and took the rest of the class outside to play for approximately 30 minutes.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will train staff, review regularly, and monitor.

Staffing and Supervision

Finding Associated with Complaint

591-1-1-32(7) requires that children be supervised at all times appropriate to the individual age, needs and capabilities of each child. Such supervision must include, but not be limited to, indoor and outdoor activities, mealtimes, naptime, transportation, field trips, and transitions between activities. "Supervision" means that the appropriate number of Staff members are physically present in the area where children are being cared for and are providing watchful oversight to the children, volunteers and Students-in-Training. The persons supervising in the child care area must be alert, positioned to maximize their ability to hear and see the children at all times, and able to respond promptly to the needs and actions of the children being supervised, as well as the actions of the volunteers and Students-in-Training, and provide timely attention to the children's actions and needs. Staff shall be attentive and participating with all children during mealtimes and shall be seated within an arm's length away from children thirty-six (36) months of age and younger. It was determined that on an undetermined date in 2022, afterschool children were not adequately supervised when a seven-year-old child took a picture of a five-year-old child's butt cheeks while playing underneath a table in the classroom. The staff member was unaware that the picture was taken. On April 13, 2022, the same two children were in the bathroom together without staff member's knowledge; however, no pictures were taken at that time. Additionally, on April 20, 2022, a five-year-old child was not adequately supervised when the staff member responsible for supervising the children left the child alone and asleep in the classroom for approximately 30 minutes while the class was outside on the playground.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will train Staff and monitor to ensure they are providing supervision and watchful oversight to the children at all times.
