- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive
- All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee

591-1-1-.32 Supervision(CR)

Finding Associated with Complaint

591-1-1-.32(7) requires that children be supervised at all times appropriate to the individual age, needs and capabilities of each child. Such supervision must include, but not be limited to, indoor and outdoor activities, mealtimes, naptime, transportation, field trips, and transitions between activities. "Supervision" means that the appropriate number of Staff members are physically present in the area where children are being cared for and are providing watchful oversight to the children, volunteers and Students-in-Training. The persons supervising in the child care area must be alert, positioned to maximize their ability to hear and see the children at all times, and able to respond promptly to the needs and actions of the children being supervised, as well as the actions of the volunteers and Students-in-Training, and provide timely attention to the children's actions and needs. Staff shall be attentive and participating with all children during mealtimes and shall be seated within an arm's length away from children thirty-six (36) months of age and younger. It was determined based on statements and interviews, that on June 12, 2023, a staff member observed redness and a swollen area on a seven-yearold child after playing outside on the playground, and staff were unaware when the incident occurred is substantiated. Staff statements revealed that the child was getting changed when the staff noticed some type of bite or sting on the child's right arm. Staff statement further revealed that they did not hear any crying or see any bugs. The staff statement mentioned that the child's arm was raised and hot to touch around the bite/sting, but during pick-up, the redness had spread up the child's arm. During the interview, three out of five children noticed bees on the playground. During the interview, child A stated that they had seen bees on the playground, and one of the child's friends had been stung by a bee on the playground. As a result, professional medical attention was obtained, and it was determined that the child suffered from an insect bite. Based on the investigation findings, the consultant found the investigation findings to be substantiated.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will train Staff and monitor to ensure they are providing supervision and watchful oversight to the children at all times.
