- New records checks will be required to be completed if a staff member experiences a six month break in service from the child care industry
- New clearance is required at least once every five years
- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive background clearance
- · All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee

591-1-1-.29(1) requires that within twenty-four (24) hours or the next work day, the Director or designated person-in-charge shall report or cause to be reported any suspected incidents of child abuse, neglect or deprivation to the local County Division of Family and Children Services in accordance with state law and to the Department, notifying that such a report was made. It was determined through a investigation on June 5, 2023, center staff reported an incident to the Department of Family and Children Services but failed to report the incident to the Department.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will develop a procedure so everyone knows how and when to report incidents of suspected child abuse, neglect or deprivation to the County Division of Family and Children Services and to the Department and will follow-up to make sure they are reported as required.
