- All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee

Due to the ongoing COVID restrictions, the deadline to become Quality Rated for programs who want to continue to receive Childcare and Parent Services (CAPS), has been extended to at least December 31, 2021.

If you do not have this liability insurance, you are required to post a notice with ½ inch letters in a conspicuous location in the program, notify the parent or guardian of each child in care in writing, obtain their signature to acknowledge receipt and maintain this written acknowledgment on file at the program at all times while the child attends the program and for 12 months after the child's last date of attendance. Finding

591-1-1-.25(13) requires that potentially hazardous equipment, materials and supplies be stored in a locked area inaccessible to children. It was determined based on observation that the following potentially hazardous equipment, materials or supplies were accessible to the children in care:

- A Clorox bleach bottle which is marked to be kept "out of the reach of children" was observed to be accessible on the boys bathroom floor in classroom F-3A.
- A used dirty wash cloth was observed to be accessible to children near the children's hand washing sink in classroom 4A.
- A broom was observed to be accessible to children in an unlocked storage closet in classroom F-3A.
- A plastic grocery bag was observed to be accessible to children as it was hanging on hook in classroom C.
- Cleaning supplies that are marked to be kept "out of reach of children" were observed to be accessible in the back building classroom which was not in use.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will identify all hazardous items and keep them in a locked area inaccessible to children. The Center will inform all Staff about hazardous items and the safe storage of those items.

Finding

591-1-1-.25(7) requires that doors to rooms not approved for child care, other than the kitchen doors, be latched or locked so children cannot wander into those areas. Except in School-age Centers, interior Center door locks shall permit Personnel to open the locked room from outside of the room in an emergency. It was determined based on observation the doors to the resource room and upstairs office were closed but not locked as required.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will routinely check that doors to unapproved rooms remain latched or locked and that Staff can open the locked rooms in an emergency.

Finding

591-1-1-.26(4) requires that playgrounds be protected from traffic or other hazards by a (4) four foot high fence or other barrier approved by this Department. Fencing material shall not present a hazard to children and shall be maintained so as to prevent children from leaving the playground area by any means other than through an approved access route. Fence gates shall be kept closed except when persons are entering or exiting the area. It was determined based on observation the following areas of the fence were not in good repair:

- Infant/toddler playground fence on the right side presented a hazard to children as they contained exposed and sharp wires at the bottom of the fence. A six inch gap was observed at the bottom of the fence and a five inch gap was observed on the gate.
- Back left playground fence had a on the left side presented a hazard to children as they contained exposed and sharp wires at the bottom of the fence. A five inch gap was observed on the back left fence.
- Right playground fence on the right side presented a hazard to children as they contained exposed and sharp wires at the bottom of the fence. A six inch gap was observed at the bottom of the middle section fence.
- Water park playground fence on the back side presented a hazard to children as they contained exposed and sharp wires at the bottom of the fence.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will routinely check the fence to determine if it is in good repair and remains at least 4 feet high, and will repair any hazards. The Center will train Staff to identify and report any fence hazards and to keep the fence gates closed when not in use.
