- New records checks will be required to be completed if a staff member experiences a six month break in service from the child care industry
- New clearance is required at least once every five years
- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive background clearance
- · All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee

Finding Associated with Complaint

591-1-1-.28(1) requires that Staff, chaperones and Students- in-Training may not be under the influence of or consume alcohol or illegal drugs at any time or place where children are present. It was determined based on investigative findings that on March 24, 2023 two center staff members clocked out of the center for their one-hour lunch break, consumed an alcoholic beverage during their lunch break, and then returned to the center to care for children after the consumption of alcohol. The two center staff members were terminated at approximately 5:00 pm on March 24, 2023.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will instruct Staff regarding this requirement and will address any signs of Staff's use of prohibited substances.
