- New records checks will be required to be completed if a staff member experiences a six month break in service from the child care industry
- New clearance is required at least once every five years
- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive background clearance
- All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee

**Finding Associated with Complaint** 

591-1-1-.12(2) requires that all equipment and furniture be free from hazardous conditions such as, but not limited to, sharp rough edges or toxic paint; and be kept clean.

It was determined that June 10, 2022, equipment was not free from hazards when a two-year-old child

sustained a finger laceration after handling a cracked, plastic toy bin. The child removed the plastic bin from a low shelf and dumped the toys on the floor, then walked away. A staff person brought the child back to clean up the toys and saw blood on the plastic bin, then realized the child's finger was bleeding. The child was not crying and gave no indication of an injury. The child received professional medical treatment and the laceration was closed with stitches.
