Further, from time to time the department discovers additional rule violations during the course of an investigation. If there are new rule violation(s), your consultant shall inform you of the violation(s) as soon as possible. However, as stated above, any violations of identical rule(s) will require the department to treat any and all additional rule violations identified in the investigation as repeated rule violations.

All rule violations found in relation to a complaint or incident investigation will be associated with the date the investigation was closed.

- New records checks will be required to be completed if a staff member experiences a six month break in service from the child care industry
- New clearance is required at least once every five years
- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive background clearance
- All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee

O.C.G.A. Section 42.1.12(i)(2) requires Bright from the Start: Georgia Department of Early Care and Learning to notify licensed child care programs on accessing and retrieving from the Georgia Bureau of Investigation's (GBI) website a list of the names and addresses of all registered sexual offenders. If you do not have this liability insurance, you are required to post a notice with ½ inch letters in a conspicuous location in the program, notify the parent or guardian of each child in care in writing, obtain their signature to acknowledge receipt and maintain this written acknowledgment on file at the program at all times while the child attends the program and for 12 months after the child's last date of attendance. 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Finding Associated with Complaint 591-1-129(3) requires the Director or designated person-in-charge to report or cause to be reported to to Department within twenty-four (24) hours or the next work day: any death of a child while in the care of the Center; any serious illness or injury requiring hospitalization or professional medical attention other than for a child while in the care of the Center; any situation when a child in care becomes missing, such as, but limited to, a child who is left on a vehicle, a child who leaves the building, playground, or property, or a child who is left behind on any trip; any fire; any structural disaster; any emergency situation that requires temperating children; and any time the program's operating status changes (i.e., open to closed or temporal closed and temporarily closed to open). Finding Associated with Complaint 591-1-132(7) requires that children be supervised at all times appropriate to the individual age, nee capabilities of each child. Such supervision must include, but not be limited to, indoor and outdoor ac mealtimes, naptime, transportation, field trips, and transitions between activities. "Supervision" mean appropriate number of Staff members are physically present in the area where children are being car are providing watchful oversight to the children, volunteers and Students-in-Training. The persons su in the child care area must be alert, positioned to maximize their ability to hear and see the children and able to respond promptly to the needs and actions of the children being supervised, as well as the of the volunteers and Students-in-Training, and provide timely attention to the children's actions and Staff shall be attentive and participating with all children during mealtimes and shall be seated within length away from children thirty-six (36) months of age and younger. It was determined based on inv findings that on April 26, 2022, a two-year-old child was injured when a staff member allowed childre the classroom without children in their line of sight and a child pushed a classroom door onto anothe foot.
