#### **Comments**

An Administrative Review was conducted on September 14, 2021. Staff files, children's files, training, and background checks were all reviewed. An in person Initial Licensing Study was conducted on September 14, 2021. The exit conference was conducted virtually on September 16, 2021 at 4:00 p.m. with the Director. A Temporary License will be issued upon completion of the Exit Conference, sumbission of tranings/Plan of Improvement, and signature pages are returned to the consultant. Facility pending Final Inspection upon receipt of Zoning Verification letter and current passing Fire Inspection. Facility does carry Liability Insurance.

- New records checks will be required to be completed if a staff member experiences a six month break in service from the child care industry
- New clearance is required at least once every five years
- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive background clearance
- All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee





## **Important New Deadlines:**

Due to the ongoing COVID restrictions, the deadline to become Quality Rated for programs who want to continue to receive Childcare and Parent Services (CAPS), has been extended to at least December 31, 2021.

The overall capacity has been increased to 224 children. During the Initial Licensing Study consultant was asked to include the cafeteria area as a licensed space for the school agers and added two (2) playground measurements that were missing. A Temporary License will be issued after the exit conference is conducted

and the required transportation trainings are submitted along with the signature pages.

Comment Please be mindful to keep items that pose a hazard inaccessible to children.		

Finding 591-1-125(8) requires protective caps on all unused electrical outlets within children's reach and requires that electrical outlets in use be made inaccessible to children. It was determined based on observation that in classrooms B and H there were cords hanging by the changing tables that could be easily accessed by the children during diapering times.

Comment Discussed maintenance of resilient surface. Please fluff and redistribute.
Finding 591-1-126(9) requires the playground to be kept clean, free from litter and free of hazards, such as but not limited to rocks, exposed tree roots and exposed sharp edges of concrete. It was determined based on observation that there were active ant beds on playgrounds A, B, C, and D. Further consultant observed that the sidewalks were not flush with the ground creating a tripping hazard on playgrounds A, B, C, and D.

each time a child enters and exits the vehicle. The driver or other designated staff person shall document in writing with a different mark/symbol to account for each child listed on the passenger transportation checklist who was not present on the vehicle for any reason. An explanation shall be documented in writing whenever a child is transported to a field trip site but is not present on the return trip to the Center. It was determined based
on review of transportation forms dated for the week of September 6, 2021 through September 10, 2021 that three (3) children were not documented as loaded or unloaded.

Finding 591-1-136(7)(d)2. requires that the second designated Staff person conduct a check of the vehicle immediately upon the completion of the first check of the vehicle. The responsible person shall physically walk through the entire vehicle; visually inspect all seat surfaces, under all seats and in all compartments or recesses in the vehicle's interior; and sign the passenger transportation checklist(s), indicating all of the children have exited the vehicle. There shall be continuous watchful oversight of the vehicle between the first check and second check. It was determined based on review of transportation forms for the week of September 6, 2021 through September 10, 2021 from Oakwood Elementary School afternoon pick up that the second staff verification signature was missing.
