The Division of Regulated Child Care (DRCC) received a self-reported incident on 3/15/19 in regards to a toddler injuring his tongue when he fell into a cabinet on 3/14/19. The director reported that she knew that that child had bit his tongue, but could not see the injury because the child would not open his mouth. Based on interviews with staff, the surveyor found the child transitioned to another toddler classroom at approximately 10:45 a.m. where he ate lunch and took a nap. The toddler staff person stated after lunch, she noticed blood coming from the child's mouth and notified staff person #2. Staff person #2 reported taking the child to the restroom where he refused to open his mouth. She stated she gave him a drink of water and he appeared to be fine. The toddler staff person stated when the child woke up from nap at approximately 2:30 p.m. she again noticed blood coming from his mouth. She stated he was fussy and felt warm to the touch. At approximately 3:00 p.m., as the toddler staff person was taking the child's temperature, staff person #3 who was assisting her noticed a deep cut on top of his tongue. Staff person #3 notified the child's parent at 3:14 p.m. via text message. The parent reported taking the child to the hospital at approximately 3:45 p.m. where he received two (2) stitches. She reported that her child was not discharged from the hospital until his 102-degree temperature and oxygen levels returned to normal which was by 8:00 p.m. that evening.</p>
