General: Based on review of documentation and interview, one (1) caregiver supervised seven (7) children for twenty (20) minutes on 09/17/18. The age of the youngest was a onevear-old child.

395 - TB Verification

General: Based on Review of Documentation and interview, the director's TB skin test documentation was dated 07/05/16. A second TB skin test documenatation was dated 07/05/18. The second TB skin test indicated the number "6" was over-written and turned into the number "8". Interview with the health professionals at the county health center revealed the director completed a TB skin test on 07/05/16 and not 07/05/18; therefore, the TB skin test documentation was altered.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, the director did not have a current TB skin test on file or physician statement. The director had TB documentation on file, it had been altered and was false.

410 - Training **Not In Compliance**

922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

- (16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
- (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and onehalf (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, a caregiver hired 07/09/17, and a caregiver hired 12/05/16, did not complete one and one-half (1 1/2) hours of pediatric abusive head trauma training. A caregiver hired 12/05/16, did not complete any training within her first year of employment. A caregiver hired 01/03/16, did not complete any annual training. A caregiver hired 02/04/16, completed her pediatric abusive head trauma training on 07/12/12, and a caregiver hired 01/03/16, completed pediatric abusive head trauma training on 04/29/13; therefore, these two (2) caregivers did not complete their pediatric abusive head trauma training every five (5) years.

- (b) Matches, cigarettes, lighters, and flammable liquids; and
- (c) Personal belongings and medications of staff.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, there was an insect/mouse glue boards located underneath the changing table on the floor, accessible to children. Documentation revealed these glue boards should not be "readily accessible to pets and children". The changing table was located by the children's toys and storage area, which were used by the children, ages two-years through four-years.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, there were dead bugs in two (2) light fixtures in the front room.

580 - Floors, Walls, Ceilings Not In Compliance

(9) Floors, walls, and ceilings shall be smooth, in good repair, and constructed to be easily cleaned.

Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, there were brown dirty spots on the walls in the front room. The carpet was frayed about four (4) feet which left strings exposed and the carpet separated at the entrance to the preschool area. The floors had dirt, grime, crumbs and a dried substance along the baseboards in the hallway and all five (5) classrooms. There was a dried substance on the floor at the entrance of the restroom beside the kitchen and the preschool area. There was dirt and grime on the floor in the restroom near the preschool area.

645 - Sink Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 10. Toilet, Diapering, and Toiletry Requirements.

- (3) A sink shall be:
- (a) Located in or immediately adjacent to toilet rooms;
- (b) Equipped with hot and cold running water that allows for hand washing;
- (c) Equipped with hot water at a minimum temperature of ninety (90) degrees Fahrenheit and a maximum of 120 degrees Fahrenheit;
- (d) Equipped with liquid soap;
- (e) Equipped with hand-drying blower or single use disposable hand drying material;
- (f) Equipped with an easily cleanable waste receptacle; and
- (g) Immediately adjacent to a changing area used for infants and toddlers.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the water temperature registered 140 degrees Fahrenheit at the portable handwashing sink in the infants' room.

Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, the seat was cracked on the blue car and the brown teeter-totter was cracked along the side. These items were located outside in the play area



820 - Indoor/Outdoor Equipment

Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 11. Toys and Furnishings.

- (2) Indoor and outdoor equipment shall:
- (a) Be clean, safe, and in good repair;
- (b) Meet the physical, developmental needs, and interests of children of different age groups;
- (c) Be free from sharp points or corners, splinters, protruding nails or bolts, loose or rusty parts, hazardous small parts, lead-based paint, poisonous material, and flaking or chalking paint; and
- (d) Be designed to guard against entrapment or situations that may cause strangulation.

General: Based on observation and interview, Front Room: The tan rug had dark spots and was torn around the ends. The bulldozer rug and the entrance rug had brown spots, crumbs and particles of grass. Three (3) ceiling lights did not work. There was an accumulation of dust on the fan, and one side of the ceiling air vent hung down from the ceiling.

Infant area: The wall vent had an accumulation of dirt and rust. Two (2) ceiling lights were out and one (1) ceiling light flickered. Interview determined the light had flickered for the past week. A nine and half (9 1/2) inch piece of wood was missing from the shutter doors. Two smoke detectors continuously chirped.

Preschool Room: The white shelves and drawers to the changing table were stained with a brown substance. The ABC rug had brown spots and frayed along the edges. The large, number-printed rug had crumbs, grass and brown spots. Four (4) ceiling lights did not work.

Preschool restroom: The yellow restroom door was splintered at the bottom. The wall vent exchange, beside the toilet, was rusty.

Preschool side 2: The green/white rug, the truck-printed rug, wheel-printed rug and the ABC-printed rug were severly stained with brown spots. Seven (7) lights did not work. The vent exchange which ran along the wall of the room had an accumulation of dust.

Also, one (1) child's high chair did not have safety straps in the infants' room. The manufacture recommended to always secure the child in the restraints.

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, three (3) children, each enrolled 08/07/18, did not have an immunizaton certificate on file.

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, a child enrolled 08/09/18, and a child enrolled 08/03/18, did not have authorization for the center to seek emergency medical care.
