# Findings:

General: Based on observation, six (6) children, from ages one (1) to four (4) years old, were combined together in the toddlers' classroom from 11:10 a.m. until 12:30 p.m. Interview determined the children were combined from 9:00 a.m. to 12:30 p.m.

- b. Within thirty (30) minutes of arrival for school-age children;
- 2. Before and after eating or handling food;
- 3. After toileting or diaper change;
- 4. After handling animals;

  - 8. Before dispensing medication; and
  - 9. If possible, before administering first aid.

- 6. Free of any items not used for diaper changing.

General: Two (2), four (4) year old children were seated at a toddler feeding table during the lunch meal on 01/08/15. This feeding table was intended for children five (5) months to twenty-four (24) months.

## **Children's Records**

1070 - Immunization Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:110. Section 3. Records.

- (1) A child-care center shall maintain:
- (a) A current immunization certificate for each child in care within thirty (30) days of the child's enrollment, unless an attending physician or the child's parent objects to the immunization of the child pursuant to KRS 214.036;

#### Findings

General: Based on review of documentation, a child enrolled 12/11/13, had an immunization certificate that was valid until 10/5/14; a child enrolled 7/23/14, had an immunization certificate that was valid until 1/5/15, and a child enrolled 4/14/14, had an immunization certificate that was valid until 10/30/14.
