420 - Program of Activities Followed

922 KAR 2:120. Section 2. Child Care Services.

(4) The child-care center shall provide a daily planned program:

- (a) Posted in writing in a conspicuous location with each age group and followed;
- (b) Of activities that are individualized and developmentally appropriate for each child served;
- (c) That provides experience to promote the individual child's physical, emotional, social, and intellectual growth and well-being; and
- (d) Unless the child-care center is a before- or after-school program that operates part day or less, that offers a variety of creative activities including:

1. Art or music;
2. Math or numbers;
3. Dramatic play;
4. Stories and books;
5. Science or nature;
6. Block building or stacking;
7. Tactile or sensory activity;
8. Multi-cultural exposure;
9. Indoor or outdoor play in which a child makes use of both small and large muscles;
10. A balance of active and quiet play, including group and individual activity;
11. An opportunity for a child to:
 - a. Have some free choice of activities;
 - b. If desired, play apart from the group at times;

Findings:

General: Based on observation, a program of activities was not developed and posted in the preschool classroom and toddlers' classroom.

520 - Inaccessible Items	Not In Compliance
922 KAR 2:120. Section 3. General Requirements. (7) The following shall be inaccessible to a child in care: (a) Toxic cleaning supplies, poisons, and insecticides; (b) Matches, cigarettes, lighters, and flammable liquids; and (c) Personal belongings and medications of staff.	
Findings: General: Based on observation, a large can of disinfectant was labeled "Keep out of reach of children," and was stored on a table, a caregiver's bottled drink was stored on the floor, and a gallon of paint was stored on a shelf in the preschool classroom. All of these items were accessible to children.	
525 - Items Accessible Only During Activity	Not In Compliance
922 KAR 2:120. Section 3. General Requirements. (8) The following shall be inaccessible to a child in care unless under direct supervision and part of planned program of instruction: (a) Knives and sharp objects; (b) Litter and rubbish; (c) Bar soap; and (d) Plastic bags not used for personal belongings.	
Findings: General: Based on observation, a box of plastic food storage bags and a large plastic garbage bag full of clothes were stored on the floor and three (3) small plastic bags were stored on a shelf in the preschool room. These items were accessible to the children and were not a part of the planned program of instruction.	
645 - Sink	Not In Compliance
922 KAR 2:120. Section 10. Toilet, Diapering, and Toiletry Requirements. (3) A sink shall be: (a) Located in or immediately adjacent to toilet rooms; (b) Equipped with hot and cold running water that allows for hand washing; (c) Equipped with hot water at a minimum temperature of ninety (90) degrees Fahrenheit and a maximum of 120 degrees Fahrenheit; (d) Equipped with liquid soap; (e) Equipped with hand-drying blower or single use disposable hand drying material; (f) Equipped with an easily cleanable waste receptacle; and (g) Immediately adjacent to a changing area used for infants and toddlers.	
Findings: General: Based on observation, there was no covered waste receptable at the handwashing sink in the toddlers' room. Soiled diapers and paper towels were observed in the uncovered waste receptable.	
Hygienic Practices In Compliance First Aid/Medication In Compliance Outdoor Play Area Not In Compliance	
755 - Protective Surface	Not In Compliance
922 KAR 2:120. Section 4. Premises Requirements. (21) A protective surface shall: (a) Be provided for outdoor play equipment used to: 1. Climb; 2. Swing; and 3. Slide; and (b) Have a fall zone equal to the height of the equipment.	
Findings: General: Based on observation, there was no protective surface material underneath the slide and climber on the outdoor playground.	
Equipment Not In Compliance	
820 - Indoor/Outdoor Equipment	Not In Compliance
922 KAR 2:120. Section 11. Toys and Furnishings. (2) Indoor and outdoor equipment shall: (a) Be clean, safe, and in good repair; (b) Meet the physical, developmental needs, and interests of children of different age groups; (c) Be free from sharp points or corners, splinters, protruding nails or bolts, loose or rusty parts, hazardous small parts, lead-based paint, poisonous material, and flaking or chalking paint; and (d) Be designed to guard against entrapment or situations that may cause strangulation.	
Findings: General: Based on observation and review of documentation, the cushion of a seat was torn and exposed foam and a wooden surface on a black chair in the preschool room. A Bumbo seat was in the toddlers' room. A review of the Consumer Product Safety Review Commission recall information determined the Bumbo seat was recalled in 2007 and consumers were instructed to order a free repair kit, which included a restraint belt and a warning label. Interview determined the center was not aware of the recall.

The child's general health status and medical history including, if applicable: (i) Allergies; (ii) Restriction on the child's participation in activities with specific instructions from the child's parent or health professional; and (iii) Permission from the parent for third-party professional services in the child-care center; e. The name and phone number of each person to be contacted in an emergency involving or impacting the child; f. Authorization by the parent for the child-care center to seek emergency medical care for the child in the parent's absence;</div>		
Findings: General: Based on interview and review of documentation, a child first date of attendance on 10/06/2020, did not have information on file to enable the person in charge to contact the child's preferred hospital.
