- (1) A person who is a child care staff member prior to January 1, 2018, shall submit to and complete background checks in accordance with this administrative regulation no later than September 30, 2018.
- (2) A child care staff member hired on or after April 1, 2018, shall:
- (a) Have completed the background checks required in accordance with this administrative regulation and been found to have no disqualifying offense prior to becoming a child care staff member; or
- (b)1. Have submitted to the background checks required in accordance with this administrative regulation;
- 2. Not be left unsupervised with a child in care pending the completion of the background checks in accordance with this administrative regulation: and
- 3. Be dismissed or relocated from the residence if the person is found to have a disqualifying background check result.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, a staff, hired 06/23/14, had not initiated the background check process. Interview with staff in charge determined the staff was a floater and was never left unsupervised with the children.

Interview determined the out-of-state request were never submitted to Indiana or Ohio.

General: Based on observation, interview and review of documentation, staff hired 12/20/18, 04/12/19, 04/24/19, 08/26/19 and 07/13/19, did not have education documentation on file

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, a staff hired on 08/26/19 did not have TB documentation on file.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, staff hired 06/13/18, 10/27/17, 08/14/18 and 07/20/15 failed to complete fifteen (15) hours of cabinet approved training hours during their subsequent year of employment. Also, staff hired 08/09/18, completed seven (7) hours of cabinet approved training hours during her subsequent year of employment. Staff hired 06/27/13, completed two (2) hours of cabinet approved training hours during her subsequent year of employment. Staff hired 06/23/14, completed six (6) hours of cabinet approved training hours during her subsequent year of employment. Eight (8) staff hired 01/28/19, 12/20/18, 06/13/18, 04/12/19, 10/01/18, 02/19/19, 08/14/18 and 04/24/19 did not complete six (6) hours of cabinet approved orientation training within the first three (3) months of employment. Three (3) caregivers hired 07/20/15, 08/14/18, and 10/27/17 did not complete the pediatric abusive head trauma training within the first year of employment.

General: Based on observation, two (2) sheets on cots were stained and soiled in the preschool classroom.
