General: Based on review of documentation, a caregiver hired 10/21/21, a caregiver hired 08/23/21, and a caregiver hired 06/14/21, did not have education verification on file.

 - 1. A statement from a health professional that the individual is free of active tuberculosis; or
 - 2. A copy of negative tuberculin results.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, a caregiver hired 10/21/21, a caregiver hired 08/23/21, a caregiver hired 06/14/21, and a caregiver hired 04/19/21, did not have TB documentation on file. A caregiver hired 06/05/2020, had TB documentation on file that was dated 08/11/19.

435 - Training

Findings:

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, a caregiver hired 06/14/21, completed two (2) hours of annual training. A caregiver hired 09/14/2020, completed five and one half (5 1/2) hours of annual training. A caregiver hired 06/29/2020, completed eleven and one half (11 1/2) hours of annual training. A caregiver hired 08/12/13, completed six and one half (6 1/2) hours of annual training. A caregiver hired 05/10/21, a caregiver hired 04/19/21, and 10/19/2020, each did not complete any annual training hours.

A caregiver hired 06/05/2020, did not complete six (6) hours of cabinet approved orientation training within the first three (3) months of employment.

A caregiver hired 08/26/2020, did not complete nine (9) hours of cabinet approved training within the first year of employment.

A caregiver hired 10/15/2020, a caregiver hired 08/31/2020, a caregiver hired 08/26/2020, a caregiver hired 07/21/2020, a caregiver hired 06/05/2020, and two (2) caregivers hired 06/29/2020, did not complete one and one half (1 1/2) hours of cabinet approved pediatric abusive head trauma within the first year of employment.

 - (c) Personal belongings and medications of staff.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, a caregiver's cell phone set on a rug on the floor in the two-year-olds' room. A caregiver's cell phone and coat set on the desk, a caregiver's cup set on a shelf and two (2) caregiver's purses set on the floor in the preschool room. These items were accessible to children.

640 - Plumbing Code

Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, the center had a portable sink, which was recently installed, in the toddlers' room. Documentation to verify the sink complied with the State Plumbing Code was not on file.

690 - Sink

Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 12. Toilet, Diapering, and Toiletry Requirements.

- (3) A sink shall be:
 - (a) Located in or immediately adjacent to toilet rooms;
 - (b) Equipped with hot and cold running water that allows for hand washing;
 - (c) Equipped with hot water at a minimum temperature of ninety (90) degrees Fahrenheit and a maximum of 120 degrees Fahrenheit;
 - (d) Equipped with liquid soap;
 - (e) Equipped with hand-drying blower or single use disposable hand drying material;
 - (f) Equipped with an easily cleanable waste receptacle; and
 - (g) Immediately adjacent to a changing area used for infants and toddlers.

Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, a handwashing sink was not immediately adjacent to the diaper changing station in the toddlers' room. Interviews revealed a portable sink was recently installed and used but the tank was empty on 10/26/21. There was no covered waste receptable at the handwashing sink in the toddlers' room. Soiled diapers and paper towels were observed in the uncovered waste receptable.

700 - Child Personal Care/Handwashing

- (a) Be helped with personal care and cleanliness based upon his or her developmental skills;**

 - b. Within thirty (30) minutes of arrival for school-age children;**
 - 2. Before and after eating or handling food;**

 - 6. After outdoor or indoor play time; and**
- (c) Use hand sanitizer or hand-sanitizing wipes if liquid soap and warm running water are not available in accordance with paragraph (b) of this subsection. The child shall wash the child's hands as soon as practicable once liquid soap and warm running water are available.**

Findings:

General: Based on observation, three (3) children did not wash their hands with liquid soap and warm running water upon arrival to the preschool room.

705 - Staff Hygiene/Handwashing

(5) Staff shall:

- (a) Maintain personal cleanliness;**
- (b) Conform to hygienic practices while on duty;**
- (c) Except as established in paragraph (d) of this subsection, wash their hands with liquid soap and running water:**

 - 2. After toileting or assisting a child in toileting;**
 - 3. Before and after diapering each child;**
 - 4. After wiping or blowing a child's or own nose;**
 - 5. After handling animals;**
 - 6. After caring for a sick child;**
 - 7. Before and after feeding a child or eating;**
 - 8. Before dispensing medication;**
 - 9. After smoking or vaping; and**
 - 10. If possible, before administering first aid; and**
- (d) Use hand sanitizer or hand-sanitizing wipes if liquid soap and warm running water are not available in accordance with paragraph (c) of this subsection. The staff shall wash the staff's hands as soon as practicable once liquid soap and warm running water are available.**

Findings:

General: Based on observation, a caregiver did not wash her hands with liquid soap and warm running water before and after she diapered two (2) children in the two-year-olds' room.

730 - Diaper Changing Area/Surface

(10) When a child is diapered, the child shall:

- (b) Be placed on a surface that is:**
 - 1. Clean;**
 - 2. Padded;**
 - 3. Free of holes, rips, tears, or other damage;**
 - 4. Nonabsorbent;**
 - 5. Easily cleaned; and**
 - 6. Free of any items not used for diaper changing.**

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the diaper changing mat was torn in four (4) places on the surface in the toddlers' room.

740 - Diapering Practice

- (12) Staff shall disinfect the diapering surface after each child is diapered.**
- (13) If staff wears disposable gloves, the gloves shall be changed and disposed after each child is diapered.**

Findings:

General: Based on observation, a caregiver did not disinfect the diaper changing mat after she diapered a child in the two-year-olds' room.

- (6) Medication, including refrigerated medication, shall be:
 - (a) Stored in a separate and locked place, out of the reach of a child unless the medication is:
 - 1. A first aid supply and is maintained in accordance with subsection (1) of this section;
 - 2. Diaper cream, sunscreen, or toothpaste. Diaper cream, sunscreen, or toothpaste shall be inaccessible to a child;
 - 3. An epinephrine auto-injector. A licensed child-care center shall comply with KRS 199.8951 and 311.646, including:
 - a. An epinephrine auto-injector shall be inaccessible to a child;
 - b. A child-care center shall have at least one (1) person onsite who has received training on the administration of an epinephrine auto-injector if the child-care center maintains an epinephrine auto-injector;
 - c. A child-care center shall seek emergency medical care for a child if an auto-injector is administered to the child; and
 - d. A child-care center shall report to the child's parent and the cabinet in accordance with 922 KAR 2:090, Section 13(1)(b) if an epinephrine auto-injector is administered to a child; or
 - 4. An emergency or rescue medication for a child in care, such as medication to respond to diabetic or asthmatic condition, as prescribed by the child's physician. Emergency or rescue medication shall be inaccessible to a child in care;
 - (b) Kept in the original bottle; and
 - (c) Properly labeled.
- (7) Medication shall not be given to a child if the medication's expiration date has passed.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, a bottle of Ibuprofen was not labeled and was stored unlocked in the refrigerator.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, black fabric was exposed throughout the playground and a long garden hose laid on the ground on the outdoor playground. They each created a tripping hazard on the playground.

 - 2. Bedding that is in good repair and is changed:
 - a. Weekly; or
 - b. Immediately if it is soiled or wet.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, seven (7) nap mats were torn and exposed foam in the preschool room.

c. The name of each person who is designated in writing to pick-up the child;

d. The child's general health status and medical history including, if applicable:

(i) Allergies;

(ii) Restriction on the child's participation in activities with specific instructions from the child's parent or health professional; and

(iii) Permission from the parent for third-party professional services in the child-care center;

e. The name and phone number of each person to be contacted in an emergency involving or impacting the child;

f. Authorization by the parent for the child-care center to seek emergency medical care for the child in the parent's absence;

General: Based on review of documentation, a child's first date of attendance on 05/10/21, and a child's first date of attendance on 02/05/21, each did not have the child's preferred physician on file.
