- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, the following staff did not complete all hours of cabinet-approved training as required during their completed training year:

- 1. A staff hired on 10/01/74 completed fourteen (14) hours of training.
- 2. A staff hired on 1/26/16 completed fourteen (14) hours of training
- 3. A staff hired on 5/01/94 completed fourteen (14) hours of training.
- 4. A staff hired on 3/05/01 completed fourteen (14) hours of training.
- 5. One staff completed orientation training late (not within the first three (3) months of employment). This staff was hired on 6/01/18 and completed orientation training on 2/07/19.
- 6. Two (2) other staff hired on 6/25/18 and 10/01/18 have not yet completed orientation training.

General: Based on observation, the men's bathroom located in the back of the facility contained a section of quarter round baseboard trim that was in disrepair. It was located under the hand washing sink area. In addition, the women's and men's bathrooms both contained dusty vents in the ceilings.

575 - Protected Openings Not In Compliance

- (8) An opening to the outside shall be effectively protected against the entrance of vermin by:
- (a) Self-closing doors;
- (b) Closed windows;

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the facility failed to ensure that openings to the outside shall be protected. The toddler 2 room (2 year-old room) contained an open window. The window did not have a screen.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, some of the walls in the facility were in disrepair as follows:

- 1. The women's bathroom, located in the back of the facility, (in the hall) contained a section of crumbled drywall behind the toilet. This crumbled section of drywall was covered with clear packing tape.
- 2. The men's bathroom, located in the back of the facility, contained a small hole in the drywall next to the toilet where a toilet paper dispenser was mounted and there a rusted mounting bracket still on the wall from the toilet paper dispenser.
- 3. In the men's bathroom, the hand washing sink was pulled away from the wall and an area of chipped paint was observed on the wall around the caulked area.
- 4. The toddler 2 room (2 year-old room) contained a tear in the paint/drywall below the window.
- 5. The toddler 2 room contained a small area of chipped paint on the wall next to the green table.

General: Based on observation, the outdoor play areas contained a foreseable hazard. Both playgrounds contained exposed landscaping cloth located under and around the play equipment that posed a tripping hazard to the children.

The chair in the four to five (4-5) year-old room contained exposed foam on the seat cushion.
