- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation completed within the first three (3) months of employment in a child-care program;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment in a child care program, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, a caregiver, hired on 07/14/16, completed ten (10) hours of training during a subsequent year of employment. A caregiver, hired on 06/24/19, completed twelve (12) hours of training during a subsequent year of employment. A caregiver, hired on 02/01/21, completed eight and a half (8 1/2) hours of training during a subsequent year of employment.

### Findings:

General: Based on observation, a dark stain was on a ceiling tile in the Busy Bees' room. Dark brown stains were on five (5) ceiling tiles in the Pre-K room. A dark stain was on a ceiling tile in the restroom between the Busy Bee's and the Adventurer's room.

# 922 KAR 2:120. Section 12. Toilet, Diapering, and Toiletry Requirements.

- (4) Each toilet shall:
- (a) Be kept in clean condition;
- (b) Be kept in good repair;

### Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, a toilet seat was broken in the restroom between the Busy Bee's and Adventurer's room. Also, the toilet room was not well lit because one the light was not operable in the restroom between the Busy Bee's and Adventurer's room.
