A review of staff files failed to reveal the submission of a CAN/CRC for an employee less that 18 years old with a hire date of 03/22/18. Interview with the staff in charge revealed the documents were not available at the time of the survey.

922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

(16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
(a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;

(b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½)

hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and

(c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and onehalf (1 $\frac{1}{2}$) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulatory requirements. A review of staff files and review of ECE-TRIS failed to reveal 15 hours of cabinet approved training for a staff member with a hire date of 10/5/09. Interview with staff in charge revealed the documentation was not available at the time of the survey.

A review of documentation failed to reveal a written evacuation plan in the event of a fire, natural disaster, or other threatening situation that may pose a health or safety hazard for a child. An interview with the staff in charge revealed the documentation was not available at the time of the survey.
