General: Based on observation, the overhead ventilation in the gross motor room had a buildup of dust on top of the ventilation system.

- (3) A sink shall be:
- (a) Located in or immediately adjacent to toilet rooms;
- (b) Equipped with hot and cold running water that allows for hand washing;

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the staff in charge did not provide vertiifacation that the files for two (2) children with the enrollment date of 08/19/2020 contained an identified preferred hospital on the enrollment form.

Due to the current declared public health emergency caused by the Novel Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19), licensed child care centers must operate under Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and public health guidelines, as mandated by 922 KAR 2:405E, to prevent the spread of COVID-19.

# Findings:

General: Based on observation, interview and review of documentation, the child care center failed to comply with the regulatory requirements specific to the storage of personal bedding as established in 922 KAR 2:410e. Based on observation, several blankets located in the four/five year-old rooms were not in individually labeled containers/bags. Continued observation revealed that eleven (11) children present were wearing masks. Review of documentation and interview revealed the children had not entered first grade and did not have parental permission to wear the mask



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
