Findings:

General: Based on observation and review of documentation, this regulatory requirement was not met. A staff member hired on 10/18/2019, did not have the results of the KARES background check on file. The finger-print page was in the staff members file but the results of the background check indicating that the staff was eligible for employment was not on

Findings:

General: Based on observation and review of documentation, this regulatory requirement was not met. The facility did not have a posted lesson plan for school-age children. The staff in charge located a lesson plan in a binder and it was dated December 2020. The lesson plan shall be posted in writing in a conspicuous location with each age group. **Premises**

Findings:

General: Based on observation and review of documentation, this regulatory requirement was not met. The facility did not have a posted snack menu. The weekly menu shall be prepared in advance, posted in a conspicuous place, and dated.

1135 - Immunization Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:090. Section 9. Records.

- (1) A child-care center shall maintain:
- (a) A current immunization certificate for each child in care within thirty (30) days of the child's enrollment, unless an attending physician or the child's parent objects to the immunization of the child pursuant to KRS 214.036;

Findings:

General: Based on observation and review of documentation, this regulatory requirement was not met. A child's file contained an immunization certificate that did not have an expiration date. This area was left blank on the immunization certificate. The child had been enrolled in excess of thirty days.

Findings:

General: Based on observation and review of documentation, this regulatory requirement was not met. Two staff members did not have current professional development plans on file. Professional development plans are to be conducted annually and documented.

1195 - Fire Drills Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 3. General Requirements.

- (12) A fire drill shall be:
- (a) Conducted during hours of operation at least monthly; and
- (b) Documented.
- (13) An earthquake drill and a tornado drill shall be:
- (a) Conducted during hours of operation at least quarterly; and
- (b) Documented.

Findings:

General: Based on observation and review of documentation, this regulatory requirement was not met. The only documented fire drill on site was from October of 2020. Fire drills shall be conducted monthly and documented.

Findings:

General: Based on observation and review of documentation, this regulatory requirement was not met. The facility did not have a posted written plan outlining the course of action in the event of a natural or manmade disaster. The facility had a diagram posted, but no written evacuation plan was posted with the diagram indicating where to go in the event of a fire, tornado, or earthquake.

Due to the current declared public health emergency caused by the Novel Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19), licensed child care centers must operate under Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and public health guidelines, as mandated by 922 KAR 2:410E, to prevent the spread of COVID-19.

Findings:

General: Based on observation and review of documentation, this regulatory requirement was not met. A substitute staff member did not have written evidence of completing the ECE 202 Requirements for Reopening Child Care training course. ECE-TRIS and the staff file were both reviewed.
