Due to the current declared public health emergency caused by the Novel Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19), licensed child care centers must operate under Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and public health guidelines, as mandated by 922 KAR 2:410E, to prevent the spread of COVID-19.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, interview and review of documentation, the center failed to assure all new staff hired shall take a mandatory training on cleaning, sanitizing, health procedures, and mandatory reporting within ninety (90) days of hire, all child care staff, directors, owners, and operators shall complete the new, mandatory training prior to the center reopening, and the maximum group size shall be fifteen (15) children per group for children aged twenty-four (24) months and older in accordance with 922 KAR 2:410E. A caregiver hired 08/11/2020, did not have documentation of completing the mandatory training within ninety (90) days of hire date. A caregiver hired 03/15/16, and a caregiver hired 09/05/17, did not have documentation of completing the mandatory training prior to the center reopening. Eighteen (18) children were grouped together from 9:45 a.m. until 12:05 p.m. in the two-year-olds' room. In addition, seventeen (17) children were grouped together from 9:45 a.m. until 12:05 p.m. in the preschool room. Interview revealed these children were grouped together daily.
