General: Based on Observation, it was found that a foster grandparent, who was leading the Preschool classroom, left seven (7) children ages one (1) year to four (4) years old unsupervised at the breakfast table while he went to open the entrance to the facility. At the time, the director, a second foster grandparent and a visitor were in the kitchen. Each of the other two (2) staff present were supervising their classrooms. The children were unsupervised for approximately two (2) minutes. The director stated that the foster grandparent should have asked for classroom coverage prior to going to the entrance.

General: Based on Observation, it was found that a foster grandparent was supervising seven (7) children ages one (1) year to four (4) years old while they were eating breakfast. The foster grandparent stated that he had been watching the children by himself for approximately fifteen (15) minutes. The director stated that she is normally in the classroom with the foster grandparent, but had other things she needed to tend to in the kitchen.

In addition, it was observed that a one (1) year old child was sitting in a high chair while eating breakfast. The safety straps on the high chair were not fastened around the child. The director stated that she did not know why the straps were not engaged or that they were not allowed to put extra mattresses in the cribs.

There was evidence that the check had been submitted. The staff person's hire date was 1/12/15, therefore, she had been employed longer than ninety (90) days without the completed check. Also, a volunteer who began with the center 6/16/15 did not have a criminal records check on file or evidence that the check had been submitted. The ninety (90) probationary period had also passed for this volunteer.
