General: Based on observation, a 30 ounce bottle of hand sanitizer was on a shelf beside a computer used by the school age children in the computer lab. An 80 count container of Clorox bleach wipes was on a book shelf, accesible to the school-age children in the computer lab. A 16 ounce bottle of hand sanitzer set on the after school care cart, accessible to the children in the cafeteria.

Findings:

General: Based on interview, a fire drill was practiced in September 2017, October 2017, December 2017 and January 2018, but the names of the children who participated, times and dates were not documented and maintained.
