922 KAR 2:400E. Emergency Regulation.

Due to the current declared public health emergency caused by the Novel Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19), licensed child care centers must operate under Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and public health guidelines, as mandated by 922 KAR 2:400E, to prevent the spread of COVID-19.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the following was found:

1) The surveyor's temperature was not taken before the surveyor was permitted entry into the child care center. Based on interview, the staff stated that they have been screening individuals with temperature checks; however, they did not think of screening the surveyor's temperature upon entrance to the center.

This deficiency was cited due to the following E-Reg: 922 KAR 2:405E

Section 6. Screening and Illness Requirements. (1) Children and adults shall be screened for fever and contagious symptoms upon entry into the child care center.

2) Based on observation, there was a staff memeber that did not have her mask covering her nose. Therefore, Proper Personal Protective Equipment Requirements were not being utilized.

This deficiency was cited due to the following E-Reg: 922 KAR 2:405E

Section 7. Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) Requirements. (1) Each adult, including parents and guardians at drop-off and pick-up, shall wear a facemask while inside a child care center: (a) Unless doing so would represent a serious risk to their health or safety and they are able to present a medical statement stating this; (b) Except during planned staff breaks and lunch away from children in care and other staff.
