Findings:

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the child care center failed to comply with regulatory programming requirements. The staff in-charge did not present verification that a current daily activity plan of programming was posted in writing that had been updated to reflect the current week that included the activities that are individualized and developmentally appropriate for each child in the school-age 1 classroom. The document presented was dated 4/19/2021.

Findings:

General: Based on observation the child care center failed to maintain an outdoor play area in accordance with regulatory requirements. Observation of the large climbing apparatus revealed four (4) blue slides that were attached, that did not have sufficient protective surfacing under and around the four (4) slides. The dirt was visible.

760 - Fences Not In Compliance

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain an outdoor play area in accordance with regulatory requirements. Observation of the double gate when entering the outside playground revealed that the latch drop rod was missing and the gate would not close properly.

- (c) Be free from sharp points or corners, splinters, protruding nails or bolts, loose or rusty parts, hazardous small parts, lead-based paint, poisonous material, and flaking or chalking paint; and
- (d) Be designed to guard against entrapment or situations that may cause strangulation.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain the premises in accordance with regulatory requirements. Observation of the black plastic playground border located on the outside play area revealed there were metal spikes protruding throughout the border around the perimiter of the playground and the spikes were accessible to the children.
