Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child-care center failed to meet this regulation. At approximately 11:28 a.m., the surveyor observed a staff person exit the "front" pre-school classroom, walk across the hall, and enter the "back" classroom. The staff person then exited the "back" classroom and entered the "front" pre-school classroom. The surveyor noted that she was carrying a gallon of milk. It is important to note that the staff person left the "front" pre-school out of ratio for a brief moment when she went to retrieve the gallon of milk. The "front" classroom had thirteen children ages three and a half to five-years-old.

General: Based on observation, the child-care center failed to meet this regulation. At approximately 11:18 a.m., during an observation in the "back" pre-school classroom, the surveyor found an air purifier cord and an upright vacuum cleaner accessible to the children in care.

Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, the child-care center failed to meet this regulation.

At approximately 11:15 a.m., the surveyor observed the children in both preschool classrooms eating lunch. Staff interview, found that parents provide two snacks and lunch for their children. The surveyor noted that some of the children did not have all of the required food components. For example, one child had cookies, strawberries, applesauce, and water. This child was missing milk, a protein, and bread. Another child had a Go-gurt, pretzels, carrots, and water. This child was missing milk, bread, and a vegetable or a fruit. Most of the children were drinking water from a beverage container provided by their parents. It is important to note, if meals are provided by the parent, the provider must supplement the child's meal if it is missing dietary components.

Emergency Regulation Not In Compliance

1255 - Emergency Regulation Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:405E. Emergency Regulation.

Due to the current declared public health emergency caused by the Novel Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19), licensed child care centers must operate under Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and public health guidelines, as mandated by 922 KAR 2:405E, to prevent the spread of COVID-19.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, interview, and review of documentation, the child-care center failed to meet this regulation. File review found a staff person hired on 8/1/2020, did not have a criminal records check processed by the State Police or Administrative Office of the Courts, nor a central registry check (CA/N). The staff person in charge presented documentation of where a central registry check was requested on 9/9/2020; however, the results were not on file. The staff person in charge stated the staff person had a criminal records check processed by the Catholic Diocese through a company named Virtus; however, this does not meet the regulation.

Based on the COVID-19 emergency regulations 922 KAR 2:405E, new staff shall undergo name-based background checks (criminal records check and a central registry child abuse/neglect check) upon hire and not be left alone with children until the name based background checks have been approved and returned. It is important to note, the staff person was not observed working alone with children during the inspection.
