Findings

Preschool: Based on Observation, it was found that upon arrival to the facility, one (1) staff person was supervising nine (9) children ages one (1) year to five (5) years old while they were eating breakfast. The classroom was observed to be out of ratio for approximately ten (10) minutes. Once the children finished eating breakfast, they were separated into the appropriate age groups and proper ratios were restored. The required staff to child ratio when a toddler is present is one (1) staff person for every six (6) children.
