(9) Floors, walls, and ceilings shall be smooth, in good repair, and constructed to be easily cleaned.

Findings:

General: Based on Observation, it was found that in the Infant classroom there were several areas of chipped paint along the walls and window sill. It was also found that there was several areas of chipped paint on the walls in the Toddler classroom. In the Pre-K 1 classroom there was observed to be dust hanging from the ceiling and stains on the bathroom door used by the preschool children for toileting and hand washing. In the restroom in the hallway used by the children for toileting and handwashing, there was observed to be a substantial amount of dust on the vent.



585 - Sink Not In Compliance

- (a) Located in or immediately adjacent to toilet rooms;
- (b) Equipped with hot and cold running water that allows for hand washing;

- (d) Equipped with liquid soap;
- (e) Equipped with hand-drying blower or single use disposable hand drying material;

- (g) Immediately adjacent to a changing area used for infants and toddlers.

General: Based on Observation, it was found that the hot water temperature in the Toddler classroom registered 130 degrees Fahrenheit.
