General: Based on review of documentation, one staff hired on 2/7/22, did not have evidence of education on file at the facility.

#### Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, a nine-month-old child was using a blanket at nap time in a crib. No loose bedding, such as a bumper or a blanket; and no toys or other items except the infant's pacifier are allowed in a crib.

#### Findings:

General: Based on observation, the bathroom located in the Toddler 2 classroom had a lot of clutter in and around the sink. Children have to walk through the clutter in order to get to the toilet and could not use the sink for washing hands. Based on interview with the teacher, the children in this classroom are currently potty training. They did have another sink in the classroom to use.

## 625 - Floors, Walls, Ceilings

(9) Floors, walls, and ceilings shall be smooth, in good repair, and constructed to be easily cleaned.

#### Findings:

General: Based on observation, the following was found:

- 1.) The wall in the preschool bathroom was in disrepair and had areas of mold and dust.
- 2.) The ceiling in the preschool classroom had excessive dust around the ceiling fans.
- 3.) The walls in the toddler 1 classroom had excessive areas of spackling, which had not yet been painted over.

### Findings:

Based on observation, the surveyor never witnessed the teacher in the preschool classroom wash her hands before or during food prep. The teacher was removing items from multiple lunch boxes and placing them on paper plates for the children, including but not limited to, opening a banana and removing the peeling before placing on a plate. It should be noted that the teacher was not wearing gloves while preparing meals.
