Provided with adequate supervision at all times by a qualified staff person who ensures the child is: a. Within scope of vision and range of voice; or b. For a school-age child, within scope of vision or range of voice; Findings: General: Based on review of documentation and interview, the surveyor determined that children are not being adequately supervised on the playground. On 10/4/18 a three-year-old child was able to climb on a chain link fence located on the playground, resulting in a scratch from the child's waistline to the child's upper abdomen. Upon interview, staff stated that playground supervision is frequently addressed in staff meetings. Staff meeting notes from 10/3/17 documented that there had been two (2) other incidents involving two (2) separate children that were believed to be the result of inadequate supervision while on the playground. **Staffing Requirements** In Compliance **Director Requirements** Not In Compliance 350 - Health, Safety, Comfort Not In Compliance 922 KAR 2:090. Section 10. Director Requirements and Responsibilities. (1) A director shall: (I) Assure the health, safety, and comfort of each child; **Findings:** General: Based on review of documentation, observation, and interview, the surveyor found that the health, safety, and comfort of a three-year-old child was compromised when the child was able to climb on a chain link fence located on the playground resulting in a scratch from the child's waistline to the child's upper abdomen. Staff reported that they were pushing other children on the swings when they observed the child climbing on the fence with one (1) foot still on the ground. The fence borders a busy high traffic street.
