#### Findings:

General: Based on observation, seventeen (17) children did not wash their hands with liquid soap and warm running water after eating snack in the school age classroom.

- (6) Medication, including refrigerated medication, shall be:
- (a) Stored in a separate and locked place, out of the reach of a child unless the medication is:
- 1. A first aid supply and is maintained in accordance with subsection (1) of this section;
- 2. Diaper cream, sunscreen, or toothpaste. Diaper cream, sunscreen, or toothpaste shall be inaccessible to a child;
- 3. An epinephrine auto-injector. A licensed child-care center shall comply with KRS 199.8951 and 311.646, including:
- a. An epinephrine auto-injector shall be inaccessible to a child:
- b. A child-care center shall have at least one (1) person onsite who has received training on the administration of an epinephrine auto-injector if the child-care center maintains an epinephrine auto-injector;
  - c. A child-care center shall seek emergency medical care for a child if an auto-injector is administered to the child; and
- d. A child-care center shall report to the child's parent and the cabinet in accordance with 922 KAR 2:090, Section 12(1)(b) if an epinephrine auto-injector is administered to a child; or
- 4. An emergency or rescue medication for a child in care, such as medication to respond to diabetic or asthmatic condition, as prescribed by the child's physician. Emergency or rescue medication shall be inaccessible to a child in care;
- (b) Kept in the original bottle; and
- (c) Properly labeled.
- (7) Medication shall not be given to a child if the medication's expiration date has passed.

### Findings

General: Based on observation, a bottle of Children's Tylenol Pain and Fever was not labeled to indicate to whom it belonged to in an unlocked medicine box, which was accessible to children, in the school age room. A tube of Colgate Total Toothpaste was not labeled to indicate to whom it belonged to in a medicine box, which was accessible to children, in the school age room.

## 922 KAR 2:405E. Emergency Regulation.

Due to the current declared public health emergency caused by the Novel Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19), licensed child care centers must operate under Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and public health guidelines, as mandated by 922 KAR 2:405E, to prevent the spread of COVID-19.

### Findings:

General: Based on observation and review of documentation, the center failed to assure:

- 1.) Children and staff shall wash meet the handwashing requirements established in 922 KAR 2:120 and wash their hands with liquid soap and warm running water or utilize hand sanitizer or hand-sanitizing wipes prior to center or home departure, in accordance with 922KAR2:405E Section 6 (6). Two (2) children did not wash their hands upon arrival to the center at 2:54 p.m. Two (2) children did not wash their hands upon arrival to the center at 2:57 p.m. Six (6) school age children did not wash their hands or utilize hand sanitizer prior to home departure.
- 2.) School-age children may wear a face mask if temperament and developmental ability permits, in accordance with 922 KAR 2:405E Section 8 (4). Upon the surveyor's entrance at 1:50 p.m., ten (10) school age children did not wear a face mask in the school age room. Two (2) school age children arrived at the center at 2:54 p.m. and removed their face mask. Two (2) school age children arrived at the center at 2:57 p.m. and removed their face mask. A school age child arrived at the center and removed their mask at 3:28 p.m. A school age child arrived at the center and removed their mask at 3:40 p.m.
- 3.) The maximum group size shall be fifteen (15) children per group for children age twenty-four (24) months and older, in accordance with 922 KAR 2:405E Section 4 (1). The group size ranged from sixteen (16) school age children to twenty-one (21) school age children during the surveyor's visit.
- 4.) Machine washable toys shall not be used, in accordance with 922 KAR 2:405E Section 6 (3). Several stuffed animals/toys were present in the school age room.
